Notes:

- Jobseeker Support Work Ready includes Jobseeker Support Work Ready, Jobseeker Support Work Ready Hardship, Jobseeker Support Work Ready Training and Jobseeker Support Work Ready Training Hardship.
- Jobseeker Support Health Condition, Injury or Disability includes Jobseeker Support Health Condition, Injury or Disability and Jobseeker Support Health Condition, Injury or Disability Hardship.
- Continuous duration for 10 months is defined as 300 days.
- Continuous duration is how long the current recipients of a benefit (or benefit group) have been continuously receiving a benefit in the wider benefit system, including time on all benefits except Unsupported Child's Benefit, Orphan's Benefit, New Zealand Superannuation, Veteran's Pension and non-beneficiary assistance.
- The location of a Ministry of Social Development service centre case managing clients has been used to approximate which Territorial Local Authority clients reside in.
- A service centre can cover more than one Territorial Local Authority area. Therefore some smaller Territorial Local Authority areas cannot be disaggregated from the service centre numbers.
- The boundaries of Work and Income offices do not correspond exactly to those of Territorial Local Authority areas, and because the boundaries of both can change over time, exact comparisons over time are not possible.
- To protect confidentiality the Ministry of Social Development uses processes to make it difficult to identify an individual person or entity from published data.
- These data tables have had random rounding to base three applied to all cell counts in the table.
- The impact of applying random rounding is that columns and rows may not add exactly to the given column or row totals.
- The published counts will never differ by more than two counts.
