Table notes:

- District data was extracted from the HWIP database on 14 March 2024.
- HWIP collects data from the 18 districts as at the end of each quarter, and data as at 30 September 2023, the most current data available
- All Data excludes casuals, contractors, and people on parental leave or leave without pay.
- Employee Count is a distinct count based on Employee Number. There is the potential for individuals to be counted more than once if they hold roles with more than one district or within the occupation group.
- All FTE values are contracted FTE (where 1 FTE = 2086 hours per year).
- Anesthetic technologists refer to people coded under ANZSCO Anaesthetic Technician (311211)
- Medical radiation technologist refer to people coded under ANZSCO 251211 Medical Diagnostic Radiographer
- Occupational Therapist refers to people coded under ANZSCO 252411.
- Physiotherapist refers to people coded under ANZSCO 252511.
- Psychiatrist refers to people coded under ANZSCO 253411
- Social worker refers to people coded under ANZSCO 272511.
- Senior Medical Officer refer to those coded under ANZSCOs within the HWIP Senior Medical Officer occupation group.

- Nurses refer to those coded under ANZSCOs within the HWIP Nursing Occupation Group. This will include Enrolled Nurse, Registered Nurse (Child & Family Health), Registered Nurse (Community Health), Registered Nurse (Critical Care & Emergency), Registered Nurse (Developmental Disability), Registered Nurse (Disability & Rehabilitation), Registered Nurse (Medical), Registered Nurse (Medical Practice), Registered Nurse (Mental Health), Registered Nurse (Perioperative), Registered Nurse (Surgical), Registered Nurse (Paediatric), Registered Nurses nec, Nurse Manager, Nurse Educator, Nurse Researcher, Nurse Practitioner, Nursing Clinical Director.
- Allied and Technical workers refer to those coded under ANZSCOs within the HWIP Allied and Scientific occupation group. This grouping includes Technical roles.
- The administration and clerical workers refer to those coded under ANZSCOs within the HWIP Corporate and Other Occupation group, this is a large grouping that includes Management and Administrative staff.
- The vacancy data we capture does not allow us to isolate positions within specific departments, as the data is only collected at the ANZSCO role level.
- Vacancy data is reported from the District recruitment/HR/Payroll/Financial systems and are the roles as at a point in time - for this extract that is 31 December 2023.
- The definition of a vacancy for the purposes of the HWIP collection is as follows:
- An unfilled position that has funding allocated and will be actively recruited for within the next six months
- It is a permanent position that is part of the FTE allocation (if applicable).
- Where a vacancy exists, it remains a vacancy when temporarily filled.
- Vacancy data is not available from the Canterbury and West Coast District, as they are undertaking data quality improvement processes.
