- MELAA refers to Middle Eastern, Latin American, and African.
- 'Unknown' is where ethnicity is not recorded. 'Other' is where ethnicities fall outside the reported ethnicities.

- Current geographic breakdowns of the beneficiary client base are only available by the Ministry of Social Development service centre responsible for their case management.
- The Ministry of Social Development can identify whether a service centre is located within a particular regional council area, but beneficiaries case managed by that centre may not necessarily reside in the regional council area concerned.
- For example, the Rotorua service centre is located in the Bay of Plenty Regional Council area but nears its border with the Waikato Regional Council.
- Some beneficiaries case managed by this centre will reside in one regional council area and some in the other.
- The region 'Other' represents those service centres that do not represent a geographic location such as call centres and processing units.
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
