

Appendix One: Count and the percentage of women who do not have a Case Manager as at 31 March 2025, by women's prison site and index offence.

Table notes:

- The number of people in prison fluctuates on a daily basis due to arrests, releases and court decisions. Corrections currently manages approximately 800 women in prison.
- The figures below also include women who have been in prison for fewer than 10 days, and those that have previously had a Case Manager allocated to them, but did not have one allocated to them as 31 March 2025. A person may also be in the process of transferring to another prison, where a Case Manager will be allocated to them after the transfer. At times, allocation to Case Manager may be delayed due to other professionals supporting them through health issues, or mental health issues.
- Figures are not directly comparable between prisons. Prison populations vary in size and demographics, including security classifications of the people they manage. Some prisons manage more people on remand while other prisons predominantly manage sentenced prisoners.
- Table two is broken down by most serious offence type, however prisoners may be imprisoned for multiple offence types.
